International Danish model **Maja Simonsen** (*Harpers Bazaar*, *Vogue*, *Costume*, *L'Officiel*, campaigns for Piaget and many others) makes her stage acting debut in the European premiere of Van Badham's acclaimed black comedy *Banging Denmark* opening at the multi-award-winning Finborough Theatre for a four-week limited season on Tuesday, 16 April 2024 (**Press Nights: Thursday**, 18 April 2024 and Friday, 19 April 2024 at 7.30pm).

A biting and hilarious new "rom-com" by one of Australia's leading social commentators (and former Literary Manager of the Finborough Theatre), Van Badham.

Feisty feminist academic Ishtar is so broke she's living in the photocopy room, following a hefty out-of-court settlement to a toxic male 'troll'. All she has left is her pride.

Management consultant Jake is high on life, with a lucrative side gig as a misogynist podcaster and pick-up artist. Until his latest crush – gorgeous Danish librarian Anne – fails to fall for his usual 'game'.

Undeterred, he makes Ishtar a cash offer she surely can't refuse to advise him how best to infiltrate Anne's no-nonsense feminist mind.

But for 1sh to accept such a deal from Jake – of all people – she would be selling her soul. Wouldn't she?

This explicit and badly behaved satire of modern manners sees Ish, Jake, their friends and a stranger navigate the battle-of-the-sexes (and the sexless).

No one will emerge unscathed...

Sydney Theatre Company's acclaimed 2019 production at the Sydney Opera House Studio was shortlisted for the 2020 NSW Premier's Literary Awards Nick Enright Prize for Playwriting.

Playwright **Van Badham** makes a long-overdue return to the Finborough Theatre where she was previously Literary Manager. Van is an internationally award-winning writer, theatre-maker and broadcaster from Australia. She is a featured columnist for *The Guardian*, and has also written for *The New York Times, Bloomberg, The Daily Telegraph* and *The Age.* She was a Walkley finalist for her non-fiction book debut, 2021's best-selling *QAnon And On: A Short and Shocking History of Internet Conspiracy Cults*, and Van was the first Australian to win Britain's Harold Hobson prize for Theatre Criticism at the National Student Drama Festival. As a theatremaker, Van's most recent plays include *A Fool in Love* (Sydney Theatre Company), *Animal Farm* (Black Swan State Theatre Company of Western Australia,

Perth), Banging Denmark (Sydney Theatre Company), Big Baby (Terrapin Puppet Theatre, Hobart), The Bloody Chamber (Malthouse Theatre, Melbourne) and The Bull, the Moon and the Coronet of Stars (Griffin Theatre Company, Sydney). Van was writer in residence at LAMDA in London for two years, and was subsequently the first Australian included in the New York Summer Play Festival. Her plays have had professional productions in Canada, the US, across the UK (including The Gabriels at the Finborough Theatre), Germany, Switzerland, Austria and Iceland. She is a former Literary Associate for Malthouse Theatre, Melbourne. Van is currently writing a second non-fiction book for Hardie Grant, as well as being under commission for new work at Melbourne Theatre Company and developing episodic television with Jungle Entertainment in Sydney. Her new musical The Questions – co-created with composer Richard Wise – premieres in July 2024 at the State Theatre Company of South Australia at the Adelaide Festival Centre.

Director **Sally Woodcock** is a director, award-winning playwright and founder-director of MESH Theatre Company.
