# LEATHER

By Peter Scott-Presland Directed by Patrick Kealey

Presented by Homo Promos in association with Neil McPherson for the Finborough Theatre. Cast: Keith Bursnall. Peter Boyle. Will Forester. Matthew Hodson. Denholm Spurr.

"I loathe violence. I don't understand how people can inflict it on each other voluntarily."

"Nobody knows what they're truly capable of. Isn't it better to use it in play-acting than keep it under some hatch which is bound to blow anyway one day?"

Following its hugely controversial run at the Finborough Theatre in 1990, Homo Promos presents a Zoom staged reading of Eric Presland's *Leather*. The reading will be live streamed on **Tuesday**, **15 June 2021 at 7.00pm**, and will then be available from **Tuesday**, **22 June to Tuesday**, **20 July 2021** on the Finborough Theatre YouTube channel, and concurrently with subtitles on Scenesaver.

Phil befriends Gordon, a rape survivor, and they become lovers. But Gordon is drawn to Phil's best friend, Terry, who is into heavy sadomasochism.

When Phil is arrested at a demonstration and kept in the police cells overnight, Terry and Gordon have sex, and Gordon realises that SM sex is a way for him to deal with his feelings as a rape survivor.

Gordon tries to keep this from Phil, but when Gordon discovers Phil's secret, he wreaks a terrible revenge...

A brave and groundbreaking play about gay domestic abuse, redolent of pain and violence in all its forms, consensual and non-consensual, as physical abuse is paralleled by mental control, and the erosion of any sense of worth.

Two members of the original cast, **Matthew Hodson** and **Keith Bursnall**, will be appearing in the Zoom reading, with the author, **Peter Scott-Presland**, present. The Zoom reading will be followed by a chance to discuss the issues involved with the cast and author.

The most controversial play Homo Promos ever produced, and the one which people keep asking to see again. It played to packed houses at the Finborough Theatre, despite an attempt by Whitbread, the brewery that owned the Finborough Arms building at the time to close it. Section 28, preventing the 'promotion of homosexuality as a pretended family relationship' was also waved at the company.

Male rape was first highlighted by *Capital Gay* in two 4-page centre spreads after Heaven nightclub used a rape scene as its Halloween 'entertainment' in 1981. Author of *Leather*, Peter Scott-Presland was one of the journalists who worked on that exposé, and the experience fed into the writing of the play which was completed in 1987, although it took three years to get a company together to stage it. When it was performed it was the first play to deal with the subject within the gay community. Many objected violently to any suggestion that it was a common occurrence. Nowadays male rape and domestic abuse is acknowledged as a major stain on LGBTQ+ life: the latest statistics suggest 18% of gay men have suffered it at some time.

Playwright **Peter Scott-Presland** founded Homo Promos in 1988, after previous companies One In Ten (1976–1979) and Consenting Adults In Public (1980–1987). He is the author of over twenty plays and six musicals including *Teatrolley*, the first of four *Plays for Hampstead Heath*, the award-winning *Sir Herbert Macrae*: A *Tribute*, the OffWestEnd Award-nominated musical *La Ronde*, the DORA-nominated *Dorothy's Travels*, *Desire*, a musical with score by Peter Murphy based on Edmund White's *States of Desire*, and *Free*, an anti-requiem with London Gay Symphony Orchestra. He directed, and collaborated on, *Anti Body*, the first play in the world to deal with HIV/AIDS issues. Most recently he has been working with Robert Ely on a cycle of seventeen mini-operas *A Gay Century: Vignettes of Gay Life 1900 – 2001*. homopromos.org @homopromos

Director **Patrick Kealey** has been a writer, director, actor and teacher for over forty years. With Group K, which he also founded, he has produced, among others, Kafka's *Amerika* (Southwark Playhouse and US), *As I Lay Dying* (BAC), and *Presto* (Riverside Studios and National Tour). He has been dramaturg for Lucidity Suitcase Intercontinental's *I7 Border Crossings* (Bogotà, Philadelphia and Edinburgh), *We Are For Sale* and *Band of Gold*. Patrick is the Artistic Director of Hastings-based Theatre Nation, and is currently rehearsing for *The Life and Rhymes of Archie and Mehitabel* for Hastings' Stable Theatre and the Brighton Festival. He is working on a three-year collaboration with the David Glass Ensemble based on the works of Beckett. He has been involved in Homo Promos Zoom performances since Spring 2020, both as an actor and a director.

Homo Promos was founded in 1988 to throw down the gauntlet to Section 28, the Conservative government's antigay legislation. It has now triumphantly survived the Bigots' Charter by eighteen years. In addition to Peter Scott-Presland's plays above, it has promoted work by lan Lucas (*Triptych, Dolpins Can Swim*), Doric Wilson (*Street Theatre*), Claire Purkiss (*Flying Lessons*), David Roddis (*Hot, Hung and Horny*) and Timothy Mason (*Levitation*). It programmed the cabaret tent at Pride in London for ten years, and has organized numerous benefit events in collaboration with other performers. In 1995, it recorded fifteen episodes of *Quiche on the Rocks* by Peter Scott-Presland and David Roddis for the Pride radio station Freedom FM. It has been performing a weekly Zoom play since March 2020, and has notched up over 50 performances, winning the International Lesbian and Gay Cultural Network's 2021 Award.
